



## THE ALLIANCE OF CIVILISATIONS AND LATIN AMERICA: NEW APPROACHES TO DIALOGUE

San José de Costa Rica – Tuesday 30th September 2008

Since its inception, the Arias Foundation has as its mission the promotion of more just, peaceful, and equitable societies in Central America, spreading a message of peace to the rest of the world. The Toledo International Centre for Peace, in its few but intense years of activity,, has become a reference point for Spanish institutions dedicated to the construction of peace. Both sponsoring foundations perceive in the Alliance of Civilisations a promising path for their peace missions, which should be exploited to its full potential. Promoting dialogue to improve understanding among nations and peoples, and to prevent intercultural conflicts is a means that should indeed be applied to situations other than the polarisation between western societies and the Islamic world. It should also address tensions between groups constituted around a common identity within a single region or State.

Consequently, this seminar will try to establish the space for dialogue at a high level that is necessary to promote the principles of the Alliance of Civilisations in the Latin American ambit. Moreover, this would be one of the first initiatives held in Latin America with the clear objective to promote and explain the principles of the Alliance of Civilisations, trying to adapt them to the particular realities of this continent..

The discussions in the seminar will be held in three complementary sessions, which will present the principles of the Alliance of Civilisations, stressing intercultural coexistence as a response to the prevailing divides in the continent, and explore new ways to build bridges between two realities which, for too long, have remained far apart, the Arab world and Latin America.

Both foundations aim, in this way, to create an adequate space for discussing the initiative launched under the auspices of the United Nations, and the possibilities for its implementation in the Latin American context. Nobel Peace Laureate Oscar Arias, President of the country hosting this seminar, has strongly supported this initiative since the beginning,, so that Costa Rica, can fulfil its merited role as a voice for peace in its global dimension.
